One of my all-time heroes of the Olympics has been Tanzanian runner, John Stephen Akhwari. At the 19-kilometer point during the 42 km marathon race, he fell, dislocated his knee and injured his shoulder. He, however, continued running and finished last among the 57 competitors who completed the race. When interviewed later and asked why he continued running, he said, "My country did not send me 5,000 miles to start the race; they sent me 5,000 miles to finish the race." Akhari's words seem to identify exactly where CUMC stands today. God didn't just bring our three churches together to start

a new building, He has brought us together to finish the new building. In the marathon race which CUMC has entered, our next big hill to climb is to vote on the approval of the final design and the final budget.

In order to vote, you must be a member of CUMC and present. There are no absentee ballots per rules of our denominational Book of Discipline. Results of the vote will be placed on the website and emailed with the Midweek Minute.

## CUMC CARE WHILE IN REHAB

One week this past winter CUMC had 7 people in the hospital, in 5 different hospitals. The pastors do their best when we know of surgeries to call the evening before to pray with members and friends, then to visit if they are in for a few days. With the ever-changing landscape of healthcare, we have found the days of rehabilitation in the hospital after surgery continues to decrease.

However where we see people staying longer is in rehabilitation centers – in Carlisle, Mechanicsburg, Camp Hill and sometimes even in Harrisburg for short and long stays. With more members in the hospital the pastors were finding it very challenging to care for hospital patients, care for grieving families, visit rehab centers throughout the area and maintain the regular responsibilities. Thankfully we found some help with

the newest team under CONNECT, our Rehab Visitors. Seven caring members who helped in other CONNECT areas in the past have stepped forward to assist with weekly phone calls and visits to all members and friends in the rehabilitation phase of recovery. CUMC, and the pastors, are so blessed to have many who have the spiritual gifts of caring for others!

Please continue to notify the pastors or church office if you or a loved one are having surgery – we really want to pray with you and visit! Please also remember that hospitals cannot tell us when and where you go after that, so a quick call or email to the church office or pastors is very appreciated. On behalf of all who have faced surgery this year, thank you for your continued prayers for surgery and recovery.



## ALTAR FLOWERS

Do you know what happens to the flowers on the Altar each Sunday? A group of caring, dedicated volunteers who are part of the Connect Ministry deliver them to our LAMs, someone in the hospital or someone at home recuperating. It helps the recipient to realize that even though they are not able to attend the worship services, they are not forgotten. The one-on-one time is a wonderful opportunity for sharing information, answering questions, listening (so important), and hopefully developing a mutually uplifting experience and lasting relationship. 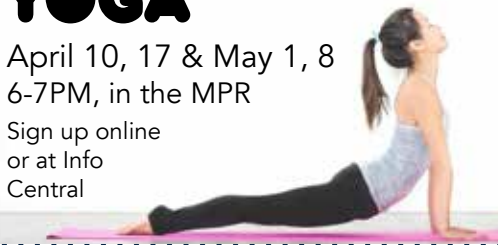

## THE SUCCESS OF WATER FILTERS

In Fall 2015 Rich Charette shared during worship service at children's message about water filters. He took a handful of dirt, put it into a 5 gallon bucket and mixed it up until the water was brown and mucky. He explained how the filter worked sharing that families in Haiti pump water at a well or get it from a river, creek or some other source. Often, the water is muddy and may contain some forms of bacteria. Rich then drank the filtered water. It looked great, but I was a bit skeptical. However I knew this was cleaner than what they were drinking, but I really did not want to drink that water and was unsure; would Haitians really use the filters regularly and correctly?

Each year for the past three years CUMC has raised funds to provide 100 water filters for families in the communities of Duroche, Sobier and Mellier. For \$35, training, a 5-gallon bucket, and filter were given to each family with the promise that the filter could filter 1 million gallons of water over 10 years when used properly.

This year when our team arrived in Mellier we realized that our bottled water missed the supply truck. WE decided to break out the water filters so we could fill our water bottles after 2.5 hours of morning worship. I was still skeptical. I didn't want to drink the water, but it was the best option and would be what we used all week – pumping water from the community well and then filtering it just as we

taught the Haitians. It tasted great, was cheaper than bottled water, and no one got sick!

For the three mornings of training, people who signed up ahead would line up an hour before the session began. Something unheard of in a culture where time is pretty irrelevant and church begins 45 minutes late, on a good day! We partnered with Water to Life, run by Bob Ford from Lufkin UMC in Texas, to give 127 families water filters that week.

In the afternoons we joined Rodney and Patrick, Water to Life Haitian staff, to walk sections of Mellier checking on some of the 800 water filters already in homes in the community. In the almost 50 homes that we visited, we found only 3 that were not being used correctly or had broken parts. Training and parts were exchanged. We met a family who received a water filter in July 2015 on one of the first Water to Life trips. They were using it successfully every day to provide clean drinking water to their family with four children. Over and over women shared how the water filters helped their families be healthier, no one was sick anymore, and how easy they were to clean and use. The families we visited invited us into their homes to show us where their filters stayed, introduced us to their children, and thanked us for the impact the water filters were making in their lives.

When our team approached Ms. Alice's Sumter, SC bungalow, we were immediately challenged. The roof had been partly repaired, yet the waves in the boards seemed to rival the north Atlantic. Entering the home, the living room floor sank markedly, as did several other areas. We were, well, overwhelmed; but God had a plan....

As we discussed the project with the site manager, he acknowledged the challenges ahead. All of us would

have preferred to move the family into a new home, but our task would be to make the home "a little warmer, a little drier, and a little safer." So that is what we did.

Our team was blessed with four very skilled, experienced people, and three willing learner/helpers. Repairs were made to the roof, floors, support structure, and plumbing. New flooring really brightened it up. 300 hours later it was warmer, drier and safer.

We believe that God sent this particular team to this house and this family to make a difference. We just needed to trust that we could do it.

# LENT

The church seasons of Lent, followed by Easter, are unique in the church. Lent calls us into a period of spiritual and personal introspection and self-denial looking to Jesus as our example and model of a life of discipleship. The highlights are Ash Wednesday (which marks the beginning of Lent) and Holy Week (a week to reflect and understand the sacrificial nature of the cross highlighted with special observations on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Easter is more than a day in the life of the church. It is a season (called Eastertide) and goes for 50 days to end at the celebration of Pentecost. We know the centerpiece of Easter is the resurrection of Jesus – which we as believers understand to be “the truth by which we stand or fall.” Below are some of the events and opportunities we will all have to mark, observe and celebrate these seasons at CUMC.

**“Restored”** – preaching series for the Sundays of Lent. The pastors will be using Rev. Tom Berlin’s book by the same title as a guide to explore the theme of redemption. We will explore how Jesus is our redeemer – what he has redeemed us from and what he has redeemed us for. Look at the latest GROW brochure
